## SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

There is nothing wrong with praying for specific needs; after all, we do it at every Mass at the prayer of the faithful, not to mention our own personal and daily prayers of petition. This gospel challenges us to go beyond specific needs and get the larger picture, to focus on the gifts God offers us always in prayer, and often in surprising and unexpected ways. What inspires confidence in us is not whether God gives us what we specifically ask for in prayer; our confidence comes from the Spirit who dwells within and establishes a most intimate relationship between God and us — shared life.

Unlike small children who seem to have a capacity to stay endlessly with some tasks, most of us need to develop a habit of daily prayer. With such busy schedules, this can be difficult. Choosing a specific time and being persistent about honoring that time for prayer helps.

## CHRISTIAN FORMATION

### CCD REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Registration for the 2010 – 2011 CCD year has begun for new and returning families. Registration information is available online at the Church of the Holy Cross website. Please click on the appropriate icons and follow the posted instructions. You will be able to view the brochure that details an overview of our program, the beginning calendar for the Kindergarten through Level 6 program and the Junior High and Confirmation programs, the CCD registration forms and the student emergency form. You can then print off the registration forms and the emergency forms (one for each child registering), fill them out and return them to the Religious Education Office for processing. The printable forms will be available in a PDF format where you will need Acrobat Reader installed on your computer in order to download this information. (Directions are on the website to help you with this.)

**This year we will continue the registration format for Confirmation preparation.** It will be done separate from the registration for Kindergarten through Junior High CCD classes. If you have a 9th grade child who will be preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the spring of 2010 and have not received the recent mailing sent to graduated 8th grade students from Holy Cross Elementary School and CCD, please go to our website and follow the instructions for registering in this program.

If you are unable to download this information or if you do not have internet capabilities, paper copies of these forms will be available all summer in the gathering space of Church, along with a drop box to receive completed registration forms. Or, you may stop by the Religious Education Office to pick up these forms or drop off completed ones. All new students **must** include a copy of their baptismal information with their CCD registration.

**Registration will be done on a first-come, first-served basis for both re-registrations and new registrations. Registration forms for the Confirmation preparation program are due in the Religious Education Office by August 17, 2010. Registration forms for the Kindergarten through Junior High CCD programs are due in the Religious Education Office by August 31, 2010. Registration for the Summer 2011 CCD program is due by December 31, 2010. Limited space is available.**

**SPECIAL NOTE:** Please remember that before a child begins sacramental preparation (First Reconciliation/First Communion), he/she needs to have been enrolled in two continuous years of religious education. Therefore, a child going into first grade this year needs to be enrolled in our program this year before beginning sacramental preparation next year. Also, a child planning to prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation must have completed Levels 7 & 8 (Pre-Confirmation).

## VIEW FROM ROME

### Benedict XVI: REMEMBER TO TAKE GOD ON VACATION

ENCOURAGES MEANINGFUL ACTIVITY

CASTEL GANDOLFO, Italy, JULY 18, 2010 (Zenit.org).- Benedict XVI is underlining the importance of using summer vacation and times of rest from work to grow closer to God and reflect on his Word. The Pope stated this today in an address before praying the midday Angelus together with those gathered in the courtyard of the papal summer residence in Castel Gandolfo.

"We are already in the heart of the summer, at least in the northern hemisphere," he noted. "This is the time in which the schools are closed and in which most vacations are concentrated."

"Even the pastoral activities of the parishes are reduced, and I myself have suspended audiences for a period," the Pontiff said. He continued, "It is therefore a favorable moment to give first place to what is effectively the most important thing in life, that is to say, listening to the Word of God."

The Holy Father spoke about today's Gospel, about the visit of Jesus to Martha and Mary. He observed that "after Jesus is accommodated, Mary sits at his feet and listens to him, while Martha is completely absorbed with much serving, which is certainly due to the exceptional guest."

"One sister is very busy and the other is enraptured by the presence of the Master and his words," Benedict XVI added.

He noted that Christ reminds Martha of "the one thing that is truly necessary," that is, "listening to the Word of the Lord."

"Everything else will pass and will be taken away from us, but the Word of God is eternal and gives meaning to our daily activity," the Pope affirmed.

He noted that "this Gospel passage is very important at vacation time, because it recalls the fact that the human person must work, must involve himself in domestic and professional concerns, to be sure, but he has need of God before all else, who is the interior light of love and truth." The Pontiff continued: "Without love, even the most important activities lose value and do not bring joy. "Without a profound meaning, everything we do is reduced to sterile and disordered activism."

The Holy Father concluded, "So let us learn, brothers, to help each other, to cooperate, but first of all to choose together the better part, which is and will always be our greater good."
